Traditional Native American Toys - Spinning Tops


Spinning tops have been made from carved bone and painted wood.

Place a toothpick through the center and spin the top.



TRADITIONAL NATIVE AMERICAN ROSETTE DESIGNS


Rosette designs are often used for decoration on clothing and jewelry.
